

# **Clacton Archers**

## **Progress Awards and Badges**

We have 4 different types of badges that can be earned, 2 during the indoor season and 2 during the outdoor season.

### **Outdoor season**

#### **Classifications**

There are 9 outdoor classifications, which are Archer 3<sup>rd</sup>, Archer 2<sup>nd</sup>, Archer 1<sup>st</sup>, Bowman 3<sup>rd</sup>, Bowman 2<sup>nd</sup>, Bowman 1<sup>st</sup>, Master, Grandmaster, and Elite master. These can be earned by achieving enough scores of a certain difficulty.

For the Archer class the rounds need to have a combined total of 12 dozen arrows, Bowman class requires a combined total of 18 dozen and Master class requires 36 dozen. Master class requires them to have been shot at a record status competition.

The rounds do not need to be the same type as long as the combined arrow count meets or exceeds the above totals, for example for an Archer class you could submit 2 Long Metrics (12 dozen total), or a Western and a Warwick (also 12 dozen total), or a National and a Western (14 dozen total).

### **Progress awards**

After six sighting arrows, you shoot three dozen arrows at a 122cm face using 5 zone scoring at a selected distance. This can be shot at 10, 15, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 80, or 100 yards with the aim of reaching the target score for that distance (please note that different scores apply for different ages and bow types). Only the first 3 dozen arrows after your sighters will count, so you can't claim more than 1 badge per day and only on the first distance shot that day. The score only needs to be reached once before the award can be claimed by handing in the countersigned score sheet to the records officer. This can be done as part of a longer round, such as a National.

Please note that the 15 Yard badge is only available to juniors and the 10 yard badge only to those in the U12 or U14 category

## Indoor season

### Classifications

There are 8 outdoor classifications, which are Indoor Archer 3<sup>rd</sup>, Indoor Archer 2<sup>nd</sup>, Indoor Archer 1<sup>st</sup>, Indoor Bowman 3<sup>rd</sup>, Indoor Bowman 2<sup>nd</sup>, Indoor Bowman 1<sup>st</sup>, Indoor Master, and Indoor Grandmaster. These can be earned by achieving enough scores of a certain difficulty.

For the Archer class the rounds need to have a combined total of 10 dozen arrows, Bowman class requires a combined total of 15 dozen and Master class requires 15 dozen. Master class requires them to have been shot at a record status competition.

The rounds do not need to be the same type as long as the combined arrow count meets or exceeds the above totals, for example for an Archer class you could submit 2 Portsmouth's

(10 dozen total), or a WA 18 and 2 Bray 1s (also 10 dozen total), or a Stafford and Worcester (11 dozen total).

## Portsmouth

Portsmouth badges are awarded once you shoot at or above the corresponding score on the badge when shooting a Portsmouth round, which is 5 dozen arrows shot on a 60cm target face at 20 yards. You can have 6 sighters as usual, but a Portsmouth needs to be the first round you shoot that day, and if you shoot more than 1 Portsmouth only the first one will count towards badges. The score only needs to be reached once before the award can be claimed by handing in the countersigned score sheet to the records officer.

The scores that can have a badge claimed start at 300 and go up by 25 points each time until 575, then up by 5 points until a maximum (perfect) score of 600.
